- (1)The ozone layer absorbs most of the ultraviolet radiation, Ozone has high concentrations of (03). The ozone layer is less than 10 per million of ozone. They learned that about 15 to 35 kilometers high from the earth, their thickness varies geographically.
- (2) Its properties were explored in detail by the British meteorologist G. M. B. Dobson, who developed a simple spectrophotometer (Dobsonmeter), than they got to know that this instrument can be used to measure atmospheric ozone layer.
